Clinics

Latest Survey said members wanted 'Hands on Clinics' so we have delivered

Well the results are in. Australian members want at least two things. Following the various responses from the latest questionnaire/survey related to the upcoming AR Convention, members want 'Hands on Clinics' and another topic that is high up there are clinics related to 'Styrene construction'. So we have delivered.

For those intrepid modellers who are willing to give the styrene building clinics a go at the AR Convention in Brisbane in August this year, then it is recommended that you bring your own tools along to your registered class. Numbers for each class at this stage will be capped at 12 attendees and all classes will be run at least twice. If demand should warrant either a larger class complement or more repetitions of a class that will be contemplated by the organising committee pending room and presenter availability.

While these classes are meant for the very beginner in scratch building with styrene, they can be attended by more experienced modellers, and hopefully the end result will be a thirst for more scratch building with styrene. Be that for buildings, wagons, or various detail items for your layouts. The Clinics currently being scheduled are 'building 6 HO scale pallets out of styrene strip', and also 'building a HO scale Clothesline out of styrene'.

In order to keep the costs for the convention down, it has been decided that attendees really need to bring their own tools. The various styrene components will be provided on the day. So the recommended tools are as follows:-

Styrene Clinics

- Cutting Mat
- Modelling knife prefer snap off blade type
- 1x30cm steel ruler
- 1x15cm steel ruler
- 1 pair of tweezers ones available from Jaycar are good and cheap
- 1 bottle of styrene glue Revell Contactor professional is preferred (due to its delayed set time)

Optional Items

Set of modelling files

Attendees to these clinics need to be aware of how they will travel to the Convention. If travelling to the Convention by Plane, please do not put a cut-off blade knife in your carry-on luggage. Checked baggage is OK. Also the airlines may also take offence of having the glue and any files in carry-on luggage may raise a question or two. Please put everything in checked baggage.

Modelling Tarpaulins Clinic

We also have another Clinic scheduled at the Convention where attendees will be able to spray paint and roll up some HO scale tarpaulins. Paints, tarpaulin material and cotton for wrapping the tarpaulins up, along with some other supporting construction materials will be provided at the clinic. To assist with this construction process, it would be appreciated if attendees to this clinic bring along their own **pair of scissors**. These are used to cut up the tarpaulin material to the size of a HO tarpaulin. Again planning may be required for any travelling via a plane, as scissors are not allowed in carry-on luggage.

• 1x pair of scissors

Convention Celebration

You still have time to construct a model for the Model Celebration!

Its five (5) months to the convention, you still have time to construct a model for the Model Celebration. Contests differ to the AP's in that we are looking for winners, the best entry. Yes, you can still earn merit as well for your AP. Knowing what in the model evaluation can help to give you that edge.

There is five (5) different attributes that is taken into account when evaluating models.

- 1. **Construction**. Complexity (0-15) Quality (0-25) Max 40 points.
 - Proper handling and selection of materials, assembly of components and parts, fit of components, neatness of glue, is it square, windows, doors, hatches are straight and plumb, repeat of multiple parts are evenly spaced. Avoid excess glue, glue cobwebs, glue on windows, fingerprints, uneven roofs, gaps in joints, mismatched joints.
- 2. **Detail.** Complexity (0-5), Completeness (0-15) Max 20 points.
 - Amount and complexity, number of subordinate parts, refinement, underbody detail for rollingstock, board by board vs scribe siding, gutters, downpipes facia boards, bolt heads, nail heads, door knobs, accuracy, completeness and placement of colour and letting.
- 3. Conformity. Completeness (0-5) Prototype Practice (0-20) Max 25 points.
 - Prototype documents, photos, completeness and placement of components as to the prototype, roof profiles, window/door locations, trucks, brake rigging, interior, era appropriate, size of structural components, thickness of walls, framing, bracing, supports.
- 4. Finish & Lettering. Complexity (0-5) Quality (0-20) Max 25 points.
 - Quality of application of paint, brush marks, unevenness, runs, thickness, amount and method of lettering, decals are straight, even spacing, bubbles, sheen and excess film, amount and

appearance of the weathering, line separation, and number of colours.

- 5. **Scratchbuilding.** Complexity (0-5), Quantity (1-10) Max 15 points.
 - Kit Construction Max 8 points.

Drew own plans, use of scratch-built detail, scratch-built masters, percent scratch-built.

Video The committee recognises that many modellers prefer to video their models in action.

A maximum of 3 minutes duration of models in action.

You may submit work in all categories; however, it is limited to a maximum of one entry only in each category.

There are no other parameters for submissions, contestants have the freedom to express visually their relationship with our hobby.

Until now this important aspect of photography hasn't been recognised.

AI. All generated images have become a Worldwide phenomenon, the committee has therefor decided to be pro-active and encourage contestants to engage with this rapidly evolving technology. The committee feel that this is an aspect of our hobby that offers exciting opportunities that need to be explored. A chance to create still images of model trains that have no foundation in realty.

Entries must be submitted **by mail** on a USB Memory Stick.

The last date that entries will be accepted for judging is **Friday**, **August 15th**.



If building models or taking photos is not for you, how about Art & Crafts, there will be a people choice award across three categories, General, Needlework and Railroadiana. Come and join in and show us your skills and be an encouragement to others.

There will be something for everyone in the celebration room each day of the clinics weekend of the convention.


